Project **Updates**

Accessibility Plan

The District of North Saanich, Town of Sidney, and District of Central Saanich are collaborating to create their first-ever municipal accessibility plans. The plans will identify common barriers, and create a roadmap to accessibility on the Saanich Peninsula. The provincially mandated plans will be developed in consultation with the Saanich Peninsula Accessibility Advisory Committee (SPAAC), and is expected to be completed by the Fall.

Briarwood Beach Access Review

The District would like to thank everyone for their input, it is greatly appreciated. At the Council meeting held on September 11, 2023, staff were directed to proceed with




recommendation 1 for the road standard and parking improvements along Glynnwood Park Road and defer the remaining recommendations (2, 3, 4 & 5) to the up-and-coming Parks Master Plan discussion scheduled for the Fall of 2023. Staff will begin design work on the roadway and parking improvements to support a 2024 summer construction implementation. Reay Creek Pedestrian Bridge

The District is pleased to have recently received permitting approval from the Province. However, due to the environmental sensitivity of the site, work on the Reay Creek Pedestrian project has been delayed until early 2024. This will ensure environmental protection measures are in place and a competitive construction procurement is obtained.

West Saanich Road Corridor Improvements

At the Regular Meeting of Council held May 15, Council directed staff to proceed with the recommended vehicle safety improvements at the Deep Cove Market parking area and the West Saanich/Wain Road intersection. Parks Master Plan

The District of North Saanich is preparing a Parks Master Plan to meet the needs of our community. The purpose of the plan is to strategically guide staff work and Council decisions on parks policy, planning, capital improvements, and management over the next 10 years (2024-2034). The plan will provide guidance for managing parks, trails and beach accesses in a cost-effective and ecologically minded manner. The Parks Master Plan will be informed through a multi-phased engagement process to ensure the plan reflects the community's vision and meets local interests and needs. Outstanding Utility Bills and Property Tax

Any unpaid 2023 property taxes, including unclaimed Homeowner Grants, are subject to an additional penalty of 5% after October 3, 2023.

A reminder that all utility bills outstanding at Dec

31, 2023, will be transferred to the property tax account on January 1, 2024, and will be subject to arrears interest thereafter until paid.

Green Waste and Outdoor Burning

Autumn leaves, woody debris, or branches scattered about your property and boulevard can be taken to the District's Green Waste Facility, at 10180 Littlewood Road. Open from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. every Saturday and the second and fourth Thursday of each month (closed on statutory holidays). Burning Season

All outdoor fires require a burning permit, which you can obtain at the Wain Road Fire Hall (986 Wain Road) starting mid-October. The burning season officially opens on November 2, 2023. Residents are permitted fires every Thursday, Friday, and Saturday of the first and third weeks of the month, until May 2024.
