Project Updates



Official Community Plan

The Official Community Plan review is ongoing. The Mayor's Official Community Plan Advisory Committee (MOCPAC), the MOCPAC working groups and staff liaisons are meeting regularly to share resources and identify potential opportunities. Staff will be forwarding a report to Council in the first quarter of 2024 which will provide a proposed public engagement plan and updated work plan for approval. Through grass roots consultation, staff will be listening to residents regarding their thoughts on the future of North Saanich and will include topics such as climate adaptation and food security, agriculture, character and community, infrastructure as well as numerous other topics. A public validation component will ensure the community is heard properly with a formal draft of the document going through further public input. The OCP process will continue to move forward under Council's direction with staff being cognizant of provincial initiatives.

Reay Creek Pedestrian Link

Reay Creek is currently out to tender for construction, closing on January 24. Construction is anticipated to start in the spring and be completed in September. Strict conditions are required of the contractor to protect tree, fish, and wildlife habitat throughout the construction period.

Lands End Multi-Use Path

Conceptual design for this project is proceeding, with work being performed by Stantec to prepare options. Recommended options and costing will be available for public comment in early spring. The report will be finalized in late spring and will be the guiding document for future detailed design and construction phases.

Deep Cove Traffic Calming

A traffic calming analysis will be performed on Tatlow, Birch, Wain, and Downey Roads in Deep Cove in early 2024. Initiating traffic calming at these neighborhood gateways are prioritized projects in the District's Active Transportation Plan, and will encourage slower speeds and greater care when leaving the major road network and entering neighborhoods. A public engagement campaign (consisting of two phases) will take place in the spring and summer.

CRD Stormwater Bylaw



Did you know that rain falling on your property can cause pollution?

Stormwater is surface water that includes water from rain, snowmelt, and irrigation. The water runs across rooftops, lawns, pavement, and other surfaces into storm drains, or seeps directly into the ground. Along its journey the water picks up contaminants like litter, fluid leaks from cars, pesticides used on lawns, and spilled paints or solvents. Storm drains are typically found in streets and parking lots to collect stormwater, ending up in our nearby waterways, creeks, rivers and the ocean. By reducing pollution in our watersheds, we can make sure natural spaces are clean and healthy.

CRD Saanich Peninsula Stormwater Source Control Bylaw No. 4168

Residents and businesses of the Saanich Peninsula must not allow the release of domestic, business, or prohibited waste into the municipal drainage system or water course. **This includes** never pouring or allowing anything but rainwater or uncontaminated water to flow into storm drains, ditches, parking lots, outdoor work areas or roadways.

443 Squadron Freedom of the Town of Sidney Parade

On Thursday, February 8, the Town of Sidney will be honoring the 80th anniversary of the 443 Maritime Helicopter Squadron and the 100th anniversary of the Royal Canadian Air Force. by holding a Freedom of the Town of Sidney Parade.

This military march is a tradition that occurs approximately once a decade in Sidney. The event is an opportunity for residents across Sidney and North Saanich to recognize and show their support for the service of the 443 Maritime Helicopter Squadron.

Beginning at 10am, members of the 443 Squadron will march from the Mary Winspear Sidney to Town Hall along Beacon Avenue. At Town Hall, there will be a short ceremony, including a Proclamation, speeches, and a military helicopter fly over. Community members of all ages are invited to attend.  - Beware of unsolicited calls or emails that ask for your personal information

 - Don't reveal personal information over social media
