# A Q&A with our New Career Firefighter, Shane Newcombe

1. What inspired you to become a firefighter, and how did your journey lead you to North Saanich?

I joined as a volunteer in Ngongotaha, New Zealand at 16 years old. My dad was in the brigade and it was a big part of our lives. I then became a career firefighter in New Zealand in 2008. I moved to North Saanich in 2020 with my family (my wife is Canadian, and her family are all here). I joined the department here in 2020 with the aim of getting my qualifications and a career firefighter job somewhere.

- **2. What excites you most about serving the community in your new role?** Helping the department grow and adapt to the growing needs of the community.
- 3. What do you think is the most important quality for a firefighter to have, and how do you embody that in your daily work?

I think adaptability is one of the most important qualities of a firefighter. Although coming to North Saanich with a lot of experience, I have had to adapt to the way things are done and terminology used.

4. What's one surprising thing about firefighting that most people wouldn't know?

There are approximately 90,000 Volunteer firefighters in Canada making 71% of all firefighters. Only 29% - 36,000 are career firefighters.



**5. When you're not on duty, what do you enjoy doing to relax and unwind?** Family is very important to me, so I spend as much time with my wife and kids, outdoors as much as possible hiking, biking, and snowboarding.

# **Tracked Trail Chipper**

This summer, our District proudly began utilizing a brand new tracked wood chipper to enhance trail maintenance across our 43 km of trails. Since the beginning of August, our dedicated staff have been actively clearing and brushing trails at a 45-degree angle, using hedge trimmers to feed debris into the chipper. This sustainable practice

allows us to spread the chipped material back into the natural environment, maintaining the ecological balance. The acquisition of this chipper was a strategic response to a key recommendation from the Community Wildfire Protection Plan (2021) and was included in our 2024 budget. Our staff, who received the chipper at the end of July, are on track to complete the trail clearing by early October. This initiative not only helps



keep our trails safe and accessible but also significantly contributes to our community's wildfire prevention efforts.

# CRD **Updates**

### **Cross Connection Control Program**

Private residential irrigation systems require a backflow device that is registered with the CRD and tested every three years. The Cross Connection Control Bylaw No. 3516 applies to all users connected to the Greater Victoria Drinking Water System. A properly maintained backflow preventer helps avoid potential connection between the drinking water system and a source of contaminated water. If you have a residential irrigation system, ensure it is protected with backflow devices installed by a certified plumber, the backflow information is registered with the CRD and the backflows are tested every three years and results reported to the CRD.

#### **File Room Improvements**

2024 has been a busy year for records management at the District. We have scanned many permanent records – agreements, building permits, bylaws, minutes. Electronically storing records improves access and provides disaster mitigation. We have saved operational costs by integrating a records management software into our main system, DocuWare. We have reviewed and categorized records located at an interim off-site storage facility and further managed records beyond their retention date, as per the District's approved schedule.

The main file storage room at the Municipal Hall houses all the District's municipal records. Council approved budget to re-purpose an unused HVAC unit bringing environmental controls to the room; and to extend the movable shelves, increasing our capacity from 849 boxes to 1236 boxes. Some of the existing shelving was reused in the smaller adjacent file room which improved accessibility and provided more storage space for permanent records.

Future projects include continuing to scan all District permit files, completing the review of records ready for destruction, and reorganizing the file storage room to separate permanent records from



those that can be destroyed in 2025 and beyond.

# **Peninsula Recreation Commission**

Are there ways you'd like to see recreation facilities improve on the Peninsula? The Town of Sidney is working with North Saanich and Central Saanich through the Peninsula Recreation Commission to consider how recreation services in the area could expand in the future. As a first step, the three communities are undertaking a recreation facility needs assessment study, which will involve a telephone survey of residents across the Peninsula in October. The study will also look at how well-used current recreation facilities are utilized.

The three municipalities have a long history of partnering on recreation services for citizens, including Panorama Recreation, which is managed on each communities' behalf by the CRD. Information about the needs assessment will be made available at panoramarecreation.ca

# Septic Maintenance Bylaw

The Capital Regional District (CRD) will begin rolling out North Saanich's inclusion in the new septic system regulations in 2025. Once the bylaw is adopted, all septic system owners will have five years to complete their required septic tank pump-out. Be sure to keep an eye out for upcoming "Septic Savvy" events in North Saanich, where residents can learn more about maintaining their systems and ensuring compliance. Any unpaid 2024 property taxes, including unclaimed Homeowner Grants, are subject to an additional penalty of 5% after October 1, 2024. A reminder that all utility bills outstanding at December 31, 2024, will be transferred to the property tax account on January 1, 2025, and will be subject to arrears interest thereafter until paid.
