

## **North Saanich Council COVID-19 Message #9**

**June 11, 2020**

The pace of new information has slowed over the last couple of weeks. We do have some news to share with you now, as things are slowly opening up again as part of Phase 2 of BC's Restart Plan.

### **Council Updates**

Our previously scheduled June 10 Community Meeting has been cancelled. We are currently working on an alternative date and format and will share that news when it is available. Please watch our social media channels and the website for updates.

Public Participation at Council meetings remains unchanged; please submit your written comments by 12 noon on the day of the meeting as members of the public are not permitted to be in attendance. Staff are considering what other reliable options might be available for members of the public to participate for events such as Public Hearings.

Staff have also made the necessary changes to enable Council Commissions and the Board of Variance to meet safely. The Climate Change Select Committee met on Tuesday, June 9 and the Community Agricultural Commission met on Wednesday, June 10. The previously scheduled March 19 Board of Variance will take place on Thursday June 18.


The District's regular tri-annual newsletter should be ready for mid-July distribution. In addition to other topics the newsletter will announce the release of an outdoor burning and green waste facility survey. Council is considering operational changes and is interested in hearing more from residents.

Property tax notices have been mailed and payment is due on July 2. We are strongly encouraging payment through online banking. Cheques can be sent via mail or left in the drop box at the Municipal Hall. Homeowner grants and property tax deferral applications can be made online. Please review the flyer accompanying your tax notice for further information.

The Municipal Hall is open only for the payment of property taxes and utility bills by debit, cash or cheque if you are unable to take advantage of the other options available.

Please continue to look after your physical and mental well-being during these challenging times. As restrictions are relaxed, look for opportunities to connect with friends and family, while adhering to the public health guidelines. Everyone will approach this transition differently, and it is important to be respectful of all the variations that you will observe.

Panorama Recreation Centre staff are working diligently to revise programs and services to follow provincial health guidelines. At this time, there is a great line-up of outdoor fitness classes planned, offered on a week by week basis. The weight room is opening this week and will be operating at 30% of normal capacity – reservations are required in advance for all services. The playground at Panorama is also open; while visiting, you are encouraged to follow health and safety guidelines and bring hand sanitizer for before and after use.

The South Island Literacy group has had to cancel this year's Open Air Library. They are considering a self-guided Storywalk as well as family literacy packages as a means to support families this summer.
